## Created Equal? Freedom Riders: Roadblocks and Redemption on "Freedom's Main Line"

The final part of the four part Created Equal series, this program, will be held at the National Constitution Center, and involves a screening of *Freedom Riders*. This film portrays the terrifying, moving, and suspenseful story of the volunteers who risked their lives to overturn racial segregation.

#### Created Equal? The Abolitionists: Radicals. Agitators. Troublemakers. Liberators.

Thursday, 4/9/15 6:00-7:30 pm, Free

This workshop is part of a four part Created Equal Series, commemorating the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment and exploring the question of whether an amendment, or any legislation, can create equality. This portion of the program will be held at the Philadelphia History Museum and include a screening of *The Abolitionists*, a documentary film that puts a face on the anti-slavery movement.

#### **Adding History to STEM**

In conjunction with The Franklin Institute's, Philadelphia Science Festival, HSP is hosting a workshop that discusses historical scientific practices in conjunction with modern studies. Participants will receive hand-on strategies for integrating history with STEM topics, such as incorporating science experiments from the nineteenth century into classroom curriculum.
